
## PINKY PROMISE

### FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

	TABLETOP 28.5" x 28.5"	THROW 56.5" x 56.5"
Fabric A	1/4 yard	1 yard
Fabric B	1/4 yard	1 yard
Fabric C	1 yard	3 1/2 yard
Binding	1/4 yard	1/2 yard
Batting	34" x 34"	62" x 62"
Backing	1 yard	3 3/4 yards

#### **BEFORE YOU BEGIN:**

- 1. Read the instructions carefully before starting.
- 2. All seam allowances are a scant  $\frac{1}{4}$ ", meaning just under  $\frac{1}{4}$ " to account for folds at the seam.
- 3. RST = Right Sides Together.
- 4. WOF = Width of Fabric, which for this pattern, is assumed to be 42" wide.
- 5. Backing is assumed to be placed with the seam running along the width of the quilt, with a 4" overhang for long-arm quilting.


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## PIECE DIAGRAM



# **CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS**

### TABLE TOPPER SIZE

FABRIC A	-Cut 1 strip 2 1/2" x WOF, and sub-cut into (16) 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" squares (A)Cut 1 strip 4 1/2" x WOF, and sub-cut into (16) 4 1/2" x 2 1/2" strips (B)	
FABRIC B	-Cut 1 strip 4 1/2" x WOF, and sub-cut into (16) 4 1/2" x 2 1/2" strips (C)Cut 1 strips 3 3/8" x WOF, and sub-cut into (6) 3 3/8" x 3 3/8" squares. (D). Trim remaining strip piece lengthwise to 2 1/2" x WOF and sub-cut into (4) 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" squares (E).	
FABRIC C	-Cut 8 strips 2 1/2" x WOF, and sub-cut into (4) 2 1/2" x 10 1/2" strips (F), (8) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips (G). With remaining strips and strip remnants, cut (80) 2 1/2" squares (H)Cut 2 strips 4 1/2" x WOF, and sub-cut into (5) 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" squares (I) and (16) 4 1/2" x 2 1/2" strips (J)Cut 1 strips 3 3/8" x WOF, and sub-cut into (6) 3 3/8" x 3 3/8" squares (K).	

### THROW SIZE

FABRIC A	-Cut 6 strips 4 1/2" x WOF, and sub-cut into (16) 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" squares (A) and (16) 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips (B).
FABRIC B	-Cut 5 strips 4 1/2" x WOF, and sub-cut into (16) 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips (C), and (4) 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" squares (E) -Cut 1 strip 5 3/8" x WOF, and sub-cut into (6) 5 3/8" x 5 3/8" squares (D)
FABRIC C	-Cut 22 strips 4 1/2" x WOF, and sub-cut into (80) 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" squares (H), and (16) 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips (J), (4) 4 1/2" x 20 1/2" strips (F). From remaining strips and strip remnants, cut (8) 4 1/2" x 16 1/2" strips (G).  -Cut 2 strips 8 1/2" x WOF, and sub-cut into (5) 8 1/2" x 8 1/2" squares (I).  -Cut 1 strip 5 3/8" x WOF, and sub-cut into (6) 5 3/8" x 5 3/8" squares (K).

## PIECING INSTRUCTIONS

### HALF SQUARE TRIANGLES

1. With a pencil, mark diagonally across piece K. Place the marked square over piece D, and sew a scant 1/4" seam on either side of the marked line. Cut along marked line, and press toward piece D. Trim to a 2 1/2" square. Make 12 HSTs.

#### FLYING GEESE

2. With a pencil, mark diagonally across 64 pieces of piece H. Place the marked square on piece B, as shown. Sew a scant seam along the marked line, and trim seam allowance to 1/4" (figure b). Press seam open. Repeat for the remaining side of pieces A. Repeat entire process with piece C, for a total of (16) Fabric A Flying Geese blocks and (16) Fabric B Flying Geese blocks.



#### SNOWBALL CORNERS

- 3. With a pencil, mark diagonally across all A pieces, and across all E pieces.
- 4. Gather piece I, and place a piece E square in the bottom right corner, as shown. Sew a scant seam along marked line, and trim a 1/4" seam allowance (figure c). Press seam open.

5. Gather (8) A pieces and (8) J pieces. Place a marked A piece on J with the diagonal going down from left to right, as shown, for (4) J pieces (figure d). Place the remaining A pieces on J with the diagonal going the opposite direction, going up left to right, as shown (figure e). Sew a scant seam along the marked line and trim a 1/4" seam allow-



ance. Press seams open.








6. Gather (4) G strips, and the remaining A squares. Place the squares on opposite ends of G with diagonal lines going from the top outside corners to the bottom inside of the strip, as shown (figure f). Sew a scant seam along the marked line, and trim a 1/4" seam allowance. Press seams open.




## **BLOCK ASSEMBLY**

The guilt is pieced into the following three blocks:

#### **BLOCK A**


- 7. Gather (8) of the remaining H squares, (4) J pieces, (4) G strips, and the F strips. Gather (8) Flying Geese blocks from both Fabric A and Fabric B, and the snowball corner blocks from step 4.
- 8. Sew an H square to the right side of (4) Flying Geese blocks from both Fabric A and Fabric B. Press seams toward H.




9. Sew the remaining Fabric A Flying Geese block to the top of the snowball block, with snowball corner on bottom right, as shown (figure g). Sew the remaining J strip to the left side of the remaining Fabric B Flying Geese unit.



10. Sew the Fabric A flying geese unit from step 8 to the left of the snowball unit from step 9, as shown (figure h). Press seam open. Sew the Fabric B flying geese unit from step 8 to the bottom of the snowball unit, as shown (figure i). Press seam open. Sew the Fabric B flying geese unit from step 9 to the right of the snowball unit, as shown (figure j), and press seams open.




11. Sew piece G to the bottom of the entire snowball unit (figure k) and press toward G. Sew piece F to the right of the snowball unit (figure I) and press towards F. Block should measure 10 1/2" x 10 1/2". Make a total of 4 Block A units.




#### **BLOCK B**


- 12. Gather the remaining H pieces and J pieces, the remaining Fabric B flying geese units, (4) Fabric A flying geese units, the snowball units from step 5 and 6, and (8) HST units.
- 13. Sew the Fabric B flying geese units together, matching points (figure m). Press seam open. Sew the left snowball unit from step 5 to the left of the flying geese unit, and the right snowball unit to the right of the flying geese unit (figure n). Press seams open.




14. Sew the HSTs to either side of piece J, with Fabric B touching piece J (figure o). Press toward piece J.



15. Sew a piece H to either side of a Fabric A flying geese unit (figure p). Press seam open. Sew the snowball unit from step 6 to the top of the flying geese unit (figure q), and press seam open. Sew HST unit from step 14 to snowball unit (figure r). Press open.




16. Sew the flying geese unit from step 13 to the top of the unit from step 15 (figure s). Press seam open. Block should measure  $8\,1/2$ " x  $10\,1/2$ ".




#### **BLOCK C**

17. From the remaining pieces, sew two Fabric A flying geese units to opposite sides of piece I (figure t). Press toward I. Sew HST units to opposite sides of the remaining Fabric A flying geese units (figure u), and press seams open.





18. Sew the HST units to top and bottom of the unit from step 17 to create a star block. Press seams open. Block should measure  $8 \frac{1}{2}$  x  $8 \frac{1}{2}$ .




# QUILT ASSEMBLY

19. Sew Block A to opposite sides of Block B, to make the top and bottom quilt rows. Press seams open.






20. Sew Block B to opposite sides of Block C, making the center quilt row. Press seams open.




21. Sew top and bottom rows to center row, and press seams open.



# FINISH THE QUILT

Cut binding fabric into 2 1/2" x WOF strips, then follow directions below.

- 1. Prepare the backing by cutting the length in half. Sew the selvedge edges of the two pieces RST. Press the seam open.
- 2. Make a "quilt sandwich" by laying the backing Wrong Side Up, then the batting, and finally the assembled quilt top Right Side Up. Baste the layers together with spray adhesive or basting pins, and quilt as desired.
- 3. Trim extra batting and backing and square up the quilt.
- 4. Prepare binding by sewing strips end to end. Iron strip in half length-wise, and sew raw binding edge to the raw edge of the quilt using a 1/4" seam allowance. Use the diagram below for assistance with corners.
- 5. Fold the binding to back of the quilt and hand sew the folded binding edge to the quilt, covering the stitch line.
